INSTRUCTIONS: Bishops should ensure the student has remained worthy to attend a Church-sponsored institution and is committed to live by the LDSBC Honor Code (see other side). LDS Business College Honor Code Summary*

LDS Business College exists to provide an education in an atmosphere consistent with the ideals and principles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. That atmosphere is created and preserved through conduct that reflects those ideals and principles. Faculty, administration, staff, and student body at LDSBC voluntarily live principles of the gospel of Jesus

Christ. Observance of such is a specific condition of enrollment. Those not members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints must also maintain the same standards of conduct, except church attendance. All who represent the College should endeavor to maintain the highest standards of honor, integrity, morality, and consideration of others “at all times and...in all places”. (Mosiah 18:9).

HONOR CODE STATEMENT

If there is anything virtuous, lovely, or of good report or praiseworthy, we seek after these things.”*

13th Article of Faith

Faculty, staff, and students of LDS Business College seek to demonstrate in daily living the moral virtues encompassed in the gospel of Jesus Christ, and will:

- ◆ Be honest
- ◆ Abstain from alcoholic beverages, tobacco, tea, coffee and substance abuse
- ◆ Live a chaste and virtuous life
- ◆ Participate regularly in church services
- ◆ Obey the law and all campus policies
- ◆ Observe Dress and Grooming Standards
- ◆ Use clean language
- ◆ Encourage others in their commitment to comply with the Honor Code
- ◆ Respect others
- ◆ Members of the opposite sex are not to visit in the bedroom areas of single students regardless if they live on or off campus.

DRESS AND GROOMING STANDARDS

The dress and grooming of men and women should be modest, neat, clean and dignified. Modesty and cleanliness should be personal hallmarks of grooming. The standards are outlined by the Board of Trustees and the *For the Strength of Youth* publication. The application may vary at various CES institutions but the principles remain the same at all Church schools.

Men: Men should maintain a clean and well-cared-for appearance with clean and neat hairstyles that avoid extreme styles or colors trimmed above the collar, leaving the ear uncovered. Sideburns should not extend below the earlobe or onto the cheek. Mustaches should be neatly trimmed and not extend below the corners of the mouth. Men are expected to shave daily; beards are not acceptable. Earrings and body piercing are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn on campus.

Women: A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Clothing is inappropriate when it is sleeveless, strapless, backless or revealing; exposes the

midriff; has slits above the knee; or is form-fitting. Dresses and skirts must be knee length or longer. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles and colors. Excessive ear piercing—more than one per ear—and other body piercing is not acceptable. Shoes should be worn on campus.

ACADEMIC HONESTY: Students are to be honest and to help others do the same. All forms of academic dishonesty, cheating, plagiarism, and similar behaviors, is unacceptable.

ECCLESIASTICAL ENDORSEMENT: All students must obtain an ecclesiastical endorsement each new academic year. Endorsements expire annually in April. Completed endorsements must be received and processed by the Registration Office for students to register for class. **LDS students** may be endorsed only by the bishop of the ward in which they live who holds their Church membership record. **Other students** are endorsed by the bishop of the LDS ward in which they currently reside or a bishop of a College student ward.
